# Sanctuary Series Gospel Music Workshop of America January 12, 2020 at 3:00 pm



Springfield will welcome back The Dayton Chapter of the Gospel Music Workshop of America (GMWA) on Sunday, January 12, 2020, at 3:00 P.M. at High St. United Methodist Church in downtown Springfield for the monthly Sanctuary Series. The event is presented without admission charge; however, a freewill offering will be collected to help support the series. A reception will follow the concert in The Commons at the church, located at 230 E. High Street. All are welcome!

The late Rev. James Cleveland founded the national GMWA organization fifty-two years ago as a symposium for amateur gospel music enthusiasts and professional gospel musicians to meet and hone their craft. Because Cleveland himself was a disciple of the *father of African-American gospel music*, the late Professor Thomas A. Dorsey, he saw the importance in equipping musicians with quality instruction in vocal technique, music theory, applied lessons and music business to strengthen ministries in churches nationwide. Today, these classes have expanded fifty-fold and many carry college-credit. Also, GMWA is represented by multiple chapters in all fifty states and delegations in Europe, Asia and Africa, making it the largest gospel music aggregation in the world.

GMWA-Dayton is forty-seven years old and has established itself as a model chapter in the national organization. The choir has shared the stage with gospel music royalty, including a recent concert with The Springfield Symphony Orchestra and Grammy-winner, Richard Smallwood. GMWA-Dayton has also performed for the Springfield Summer Arts Festival. Led by Elder Kevan B. Beamon and Kent R. Brooks, the choir will inspire with spirituals that set the early age of gospel music, anthems, congregational style singing from the *golden age of gospel*, traditional choir music and what is now considered the urban contemporary choir sound.

I'm writing to you about our upcoming Church Retreat. For the past several years, our Leadership Council has had a January all-day Retreat to start off the new year. This year, we are opening it up to all in the church who would like to attend.

Our goals for this day together include worship and fellowship, learning more about the Global Village concept and developing steps we can take to live into that vision for our church.

The Bishop has, through the Global Village designation, challenged High Street UMC alongside Covenant UMC to be a team that will work together in Springfield to improve our community. We will break for a working lunch, continuing our discussion. We'll then have breakout sessions to focus on two areas: 1) How do we develop our resources including both people and finances and 2) How will we develop our ministry to families (think those of all ages), both inside and outside of our traditional congregation. Both these sessions will involve brainstorming, dreaming, and making some specific plans. In the end, our goal is to have some "events" to put on our 2020 calendar.

We hope that not only the official "leaders" of our church but also all of those who lead us regularly with your participation, ideas, and inspiration, will be a part of this 2020 Churchwide Retreat. We'll meet at the church on Saturday, January 11<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 and finish up by 2:00. # A Letter from Our Bishop

### United Methodist Church Separation over LGBTQ+ Views

#### A letter from our Bishop:

By now, many of you have heard or read the headlines regarding the future of The United Methodist Church and a proposed separation plan. Headlines are often deceiving which may increase the number of visitors to their social media channel but often confuse the reader. Depending on the news outlet you frequent, their interpretation of the proposal may affect your immediate response. For that reason, I urge you to refer to the following information.

The first link will be found on the West Ohio Conference website. This information comes directly from the group who created the plan. I was a member of that team. After reading the document, please take time to read the links within the story, too. United Methodist News has provided this interpretation: https://www.umnews.org/en/news/diverse-leaders-group-offers-separation-plan

As I stated earlier, I was a part of the group that developed and supports this plan. Our process was robust, prayerful, respectful and hopeful. The hope is to offer something to the delegates that will assist in managing well the change that is already afoot.

Some of you may be wondering how this may impact you. I offer this: keep loving and serving Jesus. Keep loving and serving your neighbor. Keep loving and serving your church and community. There is no immediate impact. This proposal is currently in a narrative format and legislation is being developed. Only the 2020 General Conference can take decisive action. The General Conference will take place on May 5 – 15 in Minneapolis. If this approach is adopted, it will provide a clear, level field for conferences and local churches to make decisions if they feel they need to make one. It is crucial to understand that no entity is required to vote to stay or go unless they want to do so.

There will be opportunities for you to learn more in the days and weeks to come. United Methodist News intends to write a series of articles. A livestream event will take place on Monday, January 13th to provide further clarity and explanations of the plan. Once we receive more details about the livestream event, we will make them available on the conference website and social media channels.

In hope and prayer that we will all be indefatigable in pursuit of the mission of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."


# WE LOVE OUR YOUTH

## Are You Being Called in this New Year?

The Family Ministries team is coming to you with a problem that we need your help with. It's something that we've all been praying for a long time – and <u>that</u> prayer is now being answered: that more young families become a part of our church family. You saw some of those children and youth during our Advent Candle Lighting ceremonies as the sheep, a shepherd, and Mary and Joseph, and in the new Children's Choir that sang in our last 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday service. This is very exciting!


So what's the new prayer? We now have at least 10 children who come to the 11:00 service regularly. The number is not the problem. The age range of 4 - 11 years in one class is what is difficult. The older kids have been patient, but some are losing interest, and there isn't the opportunity to go deeper with them in their study of the Bible and in figuring out the meaning Jesus can have in their lives.

This class is being led by one teacher with the help of four 4 others who rotate Sundays to help. The children are great and leaders report that their own faith is strengthened by time with them. Our prayer is that each of you will be open to the possibility that God is calling you to teach, or to be one of the helpers, with either the 4-8 year old's or the 9-12 year old's during the 11:00 Service. We are particularly asking those who worship regularly at 9:30, so that others' worship is not interrupted. We will provide the training that will enable you to do this job confidently.

Children face so many challenges in our world, and helping to give them a solid foundation of Faith and Connection (to mentors and to God) is, we believe, one of the most important missions we have.

# Emmaus

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being "a servant of all."

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk typically begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekends.

During and after the three days, Emmaus leaders encourage participants to meet regularly in small groups. The members of the small groups challenge and support one another in faithful living. Participants seek to Christianize their environments of family, job, and community through the ministry of their congregations. The three-day Emmaus experience and follow-up groups strengthen and renew Christian people as disciples of Jesus Christ and as active members of the body of Christ in mission to the world.

High Street UMC is the host Church for the Springfield Area Emmaus. The Springfield Area Emmaus Community use our facility for their Emmaus Walk, monthly board meetings, team meetings, and monthly Emmaus Gatherings.

The next Emmaus Walk will be April 20th and will be a women's walk. If you or someone you know would be interested in attending the Emmaus Women's walk, you can pick-up an application in the Church office. #### **CENTRAL COMMUNITY KITCHEN**

Through the generosity of community volunteers and in collaboration with Second Harvest Food Bank, CCK feeds upwards of 100 to 150 people every Tuesday at 5:30 pm throughout the year downstairs in the Fellowship Hall.

#### **RECOVERY "X"**

This program employs physical fitness to help individuals go beyond maintaining sobriety to achieving a holistic balance for their lives. They offer classes Monday through Friday afternoons in the Recovery "X" Training Room on the ground floor.

#### **ASPIRE PROGRAM**

Clark State Community College's innovative program allows adults to earn their high school equivalency and learn English as a second language (ESL). High School Equivalency instruction is on Monday and Wednesday afternoons. ESL instruction is on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. All classes are in the computer lab on the ground floor.

#### NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS

NA has been a longstanding part of the Central Community Center's mission as it lends unmatched support to the recovery community. Meetings are Monday through Friday at noon and Tuesday nights at 7:00 PM in Room 102.

# Youth United


