HSUMC ORGAN STORY

HISTORY*

The current organ history began in 1941. The organ in use was moved from the previous church in 1904. Time had taken a toll on the organ and it had become unreliable and sometimes it would not work at all. The idea to purchase a new organ evolved. (War had started in Europe and some members thought the idea to buy a new organ should be delayed. Members that supported the idea to purchase a new organ prevailed and planning for the new organ began). A contract was given to The Schantz Organ Company in Orrville, Ohio, for a three-manual electric organ complete with 1,524 pipes ranging in size from 16 feet to 3/8 of an inch. The cost was approximately \$10,000. An individual paid \$1,200 to have a harp attached to the organ in memory of her sister. Starting in 1941, there have been 21 organists to date.

In 1946 heavy rains in the spring caused the roof to leak in various places including the new organ chambers.

CURRENT STATUS

In the spring of 2023, we discovered the walls and ceiling plaster in the organ pipe chamber (room) had major cracks and the bond between the plaster and the walls was close to collapsing. The pipes are delicate so we asked "Hunt Pipe Organ Service, LLC" to remove, clean, and repair the pipes if necessary and reinstall the pipes after the roof, walls and ceiling are repaired. All of the pipes have been removed from the room that has the water damage.

Durable Restoration Company has the capability to repair the roof and refurbish the interior of the room. They provided a bid to do their portion of the work. The Hunt Pipe Organ Service, LLC provided an initial bid but more work was added and we have not received the updated bid.

Recently, we submitted an insurance claim for the roof leaks and water damage to the room and contents. We should hear from the insurance company in the near future.

FUTURE

If the estimated cost figures are essentially correct, it appears that we can afford to complete the repairs for the organ room in 2023. Other good news is we have Lia Ferrell. Have you noticed that we continue to have organ music for the Sunday service even when one organ pipe room is completely empty? If you are like me, you probably thought how can she do that?
