Missions News: Immigrant help! With Deanna Brougher's permission, here is a quote from her recent email to Missions Team regarding "the impact our church has made on the lives of 21 Venezuelan, Mexican, and other Latin american immigrants. Our church members have provided these families with clothing, pots/pans, dishes, towels, bedding, coats and furniture. All of the families have applied and received work permits. Most have passed their drivers license test and have secured jobs. The two couples that are in their late 50's/early 60's seem to be having the most difficult time. The lack of English is a serious impediment for all of the immigrants. The lack of tutors and the cost is a huge issue. Many times these folks secure a job but tutoring is only available during their work time. Our church is blessed with many retired teachers and educated folks and offering tutoring and/or homework assistance at our church would be an incredible outreach. It could also be accomplished by pairing a church volunteer with an immigrant family so it would be easier to match available times. Socialization is a huge need."

What good work we, as a church community, have done for these families. But as Deanna says, the need for language acquisition and socialization so that these families can truly be a part of their new homes continues. Please be in prayer about how we can keep on helping. If you have suggestions or would like to help, please contact the church office or any member of Missions. Food Collection: Open Hands Free Pantry needs our food donations! Currently, their supply of nonperishable food items can not keep up with the need. Missions will again be collecting the following items for distribution at Open Hands: peanut butter and jelly, spaghetti and spaghetti sauce, canned soups, pancake mix (the "just add water" variety), macaroni and cheese, boxes of individually wrapped granola bars. These items can be left on the rolling cart (with the sign reading "Food Donations") in the Commons Hallway. Thank you for your generosity!




CENTRAL COMMUNITY CENTER


