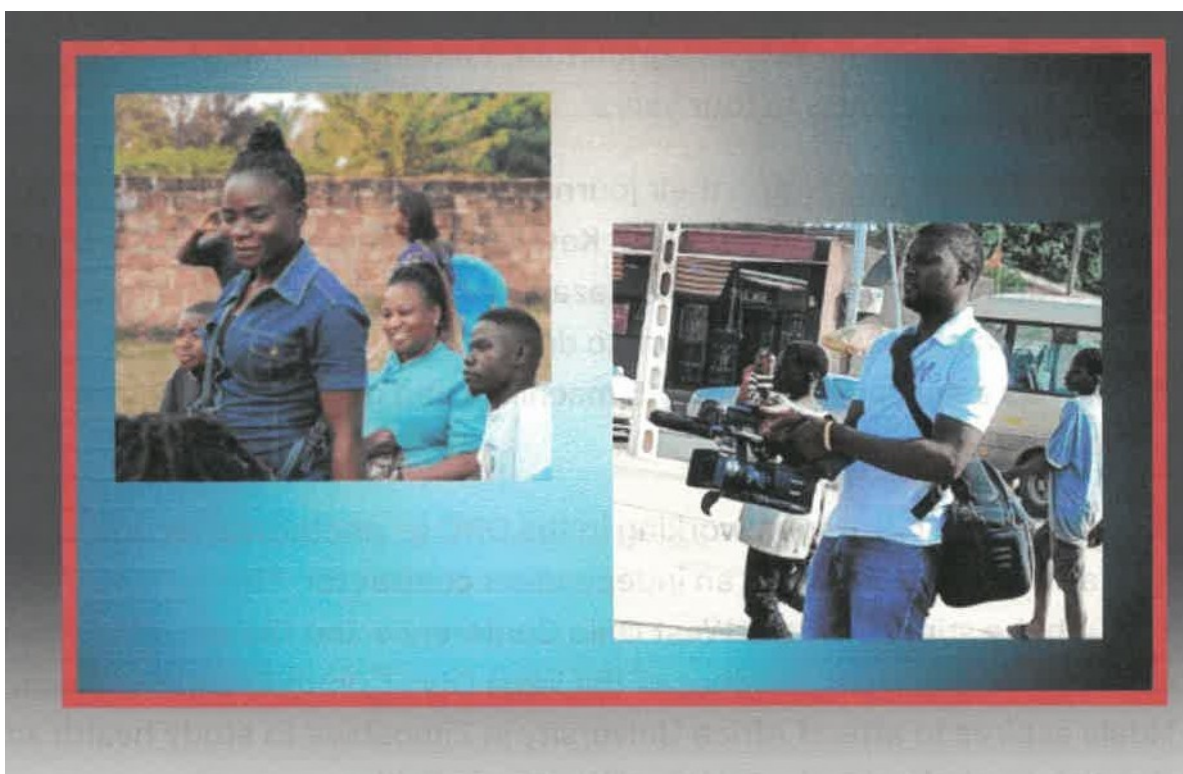

Orphanage Helps Youth Become Successful Entrepreneurs



Poverty and war left many children orphans in Kamina, Democratic Republic of the Congo. The Kamina Children's Home was created to be a place of refuge and hope for those children left parentless. Unable to find work after graduating from secondary school, many youths remain residents of the home. The unemployment rate in Kamina is 90%. Instead of releasing the young residents, Bishop Mande Muyombo decided to work toward creating pathways of training for the residents to become entrepreneurs and vital members of their communities.

West Ohio Congo Mission



Rev. Nkoko Lumbwe Emmanuel, Director of the Kamina Children's Home is working with Bishop Mande to address the immediate needs for the success of the new vision - separate dorms for the female residents and the creation of programs that will train in vocations such as agriculture, tailoring and carpentry. This new model is expected to take three to four years.

Some students have begun their journey to entrepreneurship through support from the partnership between the North Katanga and the West Ohio Conferences of The United Methodist Church. Bazille Kazadi dreams of owning a tailoring business with multiple seamstresses and tailors to design and create clothing to sell. Currently, Bazille has a space with roughly 5 machines and other tailors at a business center owned by the home.

Claudia Mboyo has begun working in the DRC as photographer and videographer for a local media outlet and as an independent contractor. This was made possible through the support of the West Ohio Conference and the donation of a video camera from a former member of the West Ohio Communications Team. Alpho Ndala aspires to attend Africa University in Zimbabwe to study health administration through a scholarship from United Women in Faith.

These are only a few of the former residents of the Kamina Children's Home who are continuing to work toward independence. Other residents of the home

- ◆ **Central Community Kitchen:** The Tuesday night meal is still being served at 5:30 pm. This meal is either sit down or to-go. Many individuals look forward to these meals due to food insecurities in Springfield. We have a volunteer base who are amazing and are working together to help feed the community and make this mission a success.



- ◆ **RSVP:** Another working partnership with United Senior Services, RSVP is a volunteer program for seniors. Central Community Center will provide volunteer opportunities to our community which can be filled by the volunteers from USS.

- ◆ **Living Waters Ministry (LWM):** Living Waters Ministry, LWM, launched October 13th! LWM takes place every Wednesday afternoon from 1:30-3:30pm. Participants sign up for 30 minute time slots during the soup kitchen on Tuesday evenings. We have been blessed to offer this opportunity to those in need living within our community. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers. The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete and submit an application. The person is then contacted and invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. The Walk to Emmaus is held in Springfield in the High Street United Methodist Church. The first walk was held in this church in 1990.
